Wednesday, February 21, 2024 - 12:00 Noon East Grand Forks City Hall Training Room

CALL TO ORDER

Warren Strandell, Chairperson, called the February 21st, 2024, meeting of the MPO Executive Policy Board to order at 12:00 p.m.

CALL OF ROLL

On a Call of Roll the following members were present: Mike Powers, Clarence Vetter, Tricia Lunski, Warren Strandell, Al Grasser, Brian Larson, and Ken Vein.

Staff present: Stephanie Halford, Executive Director; Teri Kouba, GF/EGF MPO Senior Planner; Tyler Manske, GF/EGF Planner; and Peggy McNelis, GF/EGF MPO Office Manager.

DETERMINATION OF A QUORUM

Strandell declared a quorum was present.

MATTER OF APPROVAL OF THE JANUARY 17TH, 2024 MINUTES OF THE MPO EXECUTIVE POLICY BOARD

MOVED BY POWERS, SECONDED BY VETTER, TO APPROVE THE JANUARY 17TH, 2024, MINUTES OF THE MPO EXECUTIVE POLICY BOARD, AS PRESENTED.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MATTER OF APPROVAL OF JANUARY 13TH, 2024 TO FEBRUARY 16TH, 2024 BILLS/CHECKS

MOVED BY LARSON, SECONDED BY LUNSKI, TO APPROVE THE JANUARY 13^{TH} , 2024, TO FEBRUARY 16^{TH} , 2024 BILLS/CHECKS, AS PRESENTED.

MATTER OF APPROVAL OF JANUARY 13TH, 2024 TO FEBRUARY 16TH, 2024, LIST OF ITEMS SIGNED AND APPROVED BY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Halford reported that this is an item that you will continue to see on a normal basis on our monthly agenda, it is just staff letting you know that we are reviewing, approving, and signing checks, journal entries, checking and saving account reconciliations, bills, billings, etc.

MOVED BY VETTER, SECONDED BY LUNSKI, TO APPROVE THE JANUARY 13^{TH} , 2024 TO FEBRUARY 16^{TH} , 2024 LIST OF ITEMS SIGNED AND APPROVED BY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ACTION ITEMS:

MATTER OF APPROVAL OF CONTRACT WITH BOLTON & MENK FOR THE SAFE STREETS FOR ALL (SS4A) SAFETY ACTION PLAN

Halford reported that this is for a project that we have been talking about for a while, and for which we applied for and received grant funding, and we are finally getting going on it.

Halford stated that we received three proposals and held interviews with all three firms. She said that the Selection Committee chose Bolton & Menk to do the project, and this is the contract. She explained that she did review the contract with Bolton & Menk, and we are all in agreement with the contract and want to move forward with the project.

Halford commented that the only tweaks made to the contract, that are a little bit different than our previous contracts, are some wording changes to the section where the consultant needs to show that they have done similar projects like this in the past, kind of showing their work experience; they rewrote it to say that they will have staff on the team that actually have the experience because we have run into scenarios where the firm will say that they have done that, but in reality the staff that did the work have moved on, so this now kind of reaffirms that the staff on the team actually do have the experience, so they made that change.

Halford stated that they also requested that the final document be more editable, to be able to cut and paste from it so we can use it for the grant application and things like that, so any of the graphs and wording instead of it being in PDF form it will be in word documents and in separated files so it will be a lot easier to use when we apply for the implementation grant, we can do a lot of cut and paste for that.

Halford said that those were the only two tweaks, but it is definitely still a contract layout that we have used before.

Lunski asked when we last did a Safe Streets Plan. Halford responded that this is the first time we have ever done one. She added that this is a new program, and the MPO has never applied for a grant before. She said that we did this as a joint effort with Grand Forks and East Grand Forks, so this is the first time ever and there are thoughts that maybe this will be a start of future ones that come up, or updates, but as of now this is kind of a one and done deal, but it at least makes us eligible to apply for implementation funding.

Grasser commented that it was a good catch on making sure you have the same people there, and not just the company experience, because a lot of people are moving around, and they are seeing more and more of that, so he likes that you caught that. Halford stated that that was actually a catch by the Grand Forks Engineering Department staff.

MOVED BY LARSON, SECONDED BY POWERS, TO APPROVE AUTHORIZING THE MPO EXECUTIVE POLICY BOARD CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH BOLTON & MENK, INC. TO DO THE SAFE STREETS FOR ALL (SS4A) SAFETY ACTION PLAN, NOT TO EXCEED A BUDGET OF \$399,969.51.

MATTER OF APPROVAL OF AMENDED GRAND VALLEY RFP

Manske reported that the Grand Valley RFP, the pedestrian crossing study; you've seen this already, we didn't get any bidders the last time we put this out a couple of months ago, so it is basically the exact same RFP, but we have changed the dates and pushed them back to reflect the time that we spent redoing the RFP and getting it back out there.

Manske commented that some of the reasons that we heard; just to kind of reiterate, and he may have talked about this last month to, but we heard that a lot of the consultants that were interested in the Grand Valley RFP were putting all their eggs sort of in the Safe Street For All basket and they wanted to make sure that they were putting everything towards that because that has a significantly larger budget and is a much larger project, so they seemed more interested in that project, but now that that is done and over with, with the Bolton & Menk contract already approved, we heard that there might be some more interest this time around.

Manske referred to the document and stated that you will see the more significant changes on page 10, where the dates have been changed, and then on page 11 we made a similar change to the wording as was done to the SS4A project, where it states: "Demonstrates the firm's designated team members' knowledge and experience rather than the firms themselves"; just making sure that the people on the team are the ones that have that experience because many of the firms have done these things in the past, but they might have changed over their employees.

Manske stated that those are pretty much the only changes that were made, and the Technical Advisory Committee did recommend approval of the RFP.

MOVED BY GRASSER, SECONDED BY LUNSKI, TO APPROVE THE FINAL AMENDED GRAND VALLEY PEDESTRIAN CROSSING STUDY RFP, AS PRESENTED.

MATTER OF APPROVAL OF MINNESOTA CARBON REDUCTION PROGRAM PROJECT FUNDING SOLICITATION

Kouba reported that Minnesota has used Carbon Reduction Program funding, and they have decided to basically divide out a formula funding and they are about to release their solicitations, but given the fact that East Grand Forks is getting a rather small amount, in order to bring forward any projects we worked with the East Grand Forks City Engineer, as well MnDOT and worked out an agreement to get the bulk of funding. She said that we have a project currently in 2024 that is underfunded so an agreement was made where we would zero out the rest of East Grand Forks' formula funding to advance construct the project and bring it into 2024, and the Minnesota Area Transportation Program is going to cover those funds and we will pay them back.

Kouba stated that this has been agreed to by the ATP, so we are just looking at agreeing with the advanced construction and using the carbon reduction funds for the proposed project, and when we approve the T.I.P. it will then be included in the document.

Lunski asked if she could tell a little bit more about the actual project; is it reducing traffic by adding more bike paths. Kouba responded that the idea is to be able to reduce the carbon footprint as a whole. She said that there are different types of projects that we can use the funds on. She stated that Minnesota has set up a list of the types of projects from actually adding to transit for transit funds, or for getting electric vehicle infrastructure involved, as well as using it for bike and pedestrian projects, anything that will support reducing the carbon footprint. Lunski said it is preventing more carbon from emitting, not changing existing carbon.

MOVED BY VETTER, SECONDED BY LARSON, TO APPROVE USING ADVANCED FY2025 CARBON REDUCTION PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE CURRENT 2024 PROJECT.

MATTER OF APPROVAL OF 2024-2027 T.I.P. AMENDMENT

Kouba reported that this is the third amendment to the 2024-2027 T.I.P. She explained that the NDDOT brought forward a project for the eastern part of North Dakota, and includes various locations throughout the eastern portion of North Dakota, with one location being in our MPO area so we need to include the project in our T.I.P. as well as their S.T.I.P.

Kouba commented that because it is hard to carve out a single project, plus it looks odd if we have just one portion of a project listed in our T.I.P., we list out the full cost of the project, so it is for all of eastern North Dakota, not just our MPO area. She stated that this is a rehabilitation/maintenance project.

Kouba said that the other change to the T.I.P. is adding in the advanced construction project we just approved for the carbon reduction program funds, so we are also changing the total cost of the project as it has increased for the bike and sidewalk project on 4th in East Grand Forks, and we are adding in the additional funds that we advance constructed and then we are including it in 2025, paying back those funds in 2025.

Kouba stated that North Dakota is adding carbon reduction funds into one of their projects to hopefully offset some of the costs, so kind of an administrative modification was made since it was brought forward to the Technical Advisory Committee. She said that it is only including those funds so there is no actual change in cost, it is a very insignificant change, so it warranted only an administrative modification.

Strandell asked to go back to the diagram showing where the project is located and commented that it is converting a right-angle turn into a blended turn, and that is not what their county engineer is always proposing. Kouba responded that this is the sidewalk and bike path along 4th and 5th. Strandell said that he knows that Rich Sanders would be up in the air if it was the road, he doesn't like those things. Kouba stated that that project is being added into the T.I.P.

NON-ACTION ITEMS:

MATTER OF FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION UPDATE

Kouba reported that this is kind of just updating the board, and we received information from the NDDOT, part of this update of the functional classification is also kind of the second half of the

reclassification of the urbanized area so we are making sure that the functional classifications inside the new urbanized area are what is necessary.

Kouba stated that she has put together a meeting with Grand Forks Engineering and Planning, the Grand Forks County Engineer, and the NDDOT-Grand Forks District just to kind of really go over it and look at that information, but just from a first glance at everything, the functional classification in North Dakota is going to mostly be kind of that North Dakota has a fine definition of urban versus rural so anything functionally classified has to be classified as urban instead of rural, so that is mostly what they will be looking at but we want to make sure that everybody has the input that they feel is necessary into the full process.

Kouba commented that in reality Minnesota has not started this process, and they are not looking at it because they did a full state-wide functional reclassification in 2015 and in Minnesota they don't really have as clear a process of defining the dividing point of urban versus rural in the functional classifications, so we aren't really thinking that it needs to be any kind of overall changes in our functional classification, we did work in 2019 in Grand Forks to look at some of the functional classification changes so it is just more looking at rural versus urban, but we are getting together and making sure we are all clear on what is needing to be done, so this is just kind of an update for this body.

OTHER BUSINESS

- A) 2024/2025 Annual Work Program Project Update Halford commented that this is just where we are at with projects in our work program.
 - 1) Street and Highway Plan/MTP: Halford stated that we did finish the Street and Highway Plan and MTP, that is done.
 - 2) ITS Architecture: Halford said that we have the ITS Architecture on the way. She added that the timeline for this project was shortened up, originally, we were looking at a December completion date but with the current contract that we have in place with ATAC, which ends in September, we pushed the completion date to the August/September time frame. She said that they felt comfortable with that so as long at they are comfortable with that we are fine with it as well.
 - 3) Land Use Plan: Halford stated that we are looking at the 2025/2026 timeline for that, so we haven't started anything with that, but it is always kind of nice to have that on the forefront of what is coming up.
 - 4) Micro-Transit Study: Halford said that that will probably begin next year.
 - 5) Grand Valley Study: Halford stated that we already had an update on this project, so hopefully we get proposals this time and we will start to see movement on it.

- 6) Safe Street For All: Halford said that we received three proposals, did interviews, and now we will be signing the contract today and then get going on it tomorrow.
- 7) Functional Class: Halford said that we already had an update on this project.
- 8) One-Way Pairs: Halford stated that we will probably get going on this soon, and it will continue into 2025. She explained that this project is looking at the two one-way streets, North 3rd and North 4th on the Grand Forks Side from DeMers to Gateway, to determine if they should continue being one-way streets or become two-way streets. She added that currently UND students are looking at them as kind of a class project, so the plan is for them to finish their studies and for us to take over from where they leave off on it.
- 9) Bike Map: Halford said that we just sent the updated bike map to the printers.

Powers asked if there is a speed limit on bike paths. Halford responded that she thinks there is, but she doesn't know what it is off the top of her head. Kouba stated that she knows that in East Grand Forks there is a signed section that has a 10-mph limit, but you can reach that pretty quick, especially on a down-hill section. Powers said that when you can hear the wind going through the wheels of their bicycles you can tell they are cruising, so he is just curious. Manske stated that he doesn't know if there is a speed limit here, locally, but he knows that nationally a lot of the e-bikes get throttled at like 28 mph, so he wonders if that has something to do with it. He added that they can actually go higher than that, but if you are using a shared use path, they are usually held at 28 mph.

- B) MPO Updates Halford said that the only update she wanted to put on your radar was that our next MPO Executive Policy Board Meeting will be held in the Council Chambers. She explained that there is another meeting scheduled at that time in the training room, so we agreed to move to the council chambers.

Matter of approval of the discussion of the functional classification.

Background:

In 2023, MPO staff worked with all our partners to adjust the Census defined Urbanized Area to an Urbanized Area that reflects the urban area we live and work in every day. The next step is for roadway functional classification to match the new urban boundary.

On January 8, 2024, North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) sent a letter requesting that Forks MPO begin the update of the roadway functional classification. NDDOT asks for a preliminary review to be submitted by April 1, 2024. Once NDDOT reviews and comments, the MPO has until July 1, 2024 to submit the final functional classification system.


After discussion with our partners, the only changes will be to designate functionally classified road way urban that was previously rural. This only affects the pots of funding that can be used on the roadways.

- The changes are only to functionally classified roadway that are now in the adjusted urbanized area.



SUBJECT: ROADWAY FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION UPDATES TO ADJUSTED URBANIZED AREA BOUNDARY

Thank you for your efforts to complete the Adjusted Urbanized Area boundary before the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) deadline of December 29, 2023. The next step in the update process related to the 2020 US Decennial Census is for the MPO to update the roadway functional classification to match the new boundary.

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) is requesting that you begin the update to the roadway functional classification system. The functional classification system identifies the roadways that will qualify for federal funding within various NDDOT funding programs. The functional class system needs to be well defined and make sense for the context of the roadway being classified. Roadway classification will consider various criteria such as, lane and shoulder widths, daily traffic volumes, access control, facility type, roadway function and any other contextual items relevant to the classification.

FHWA has prepared a guidance document for reference in updating the functional classification system. The document is called *Highway Functional Classification Concepts, Criteria and Procedures*, 2023 Edition. Here is a link to the document:

https://www.fhwa.dot.gov/planning/processes/statewide/related/hwy-functional-classification-2023.pdf. This document provides real world examples as well as detailed information on each roadway classification. Please utilize this reference in your update process. There are a couple of exceptions to the guidance:

- 1. NDDOT will only recognize one classification of Principal Arterials.
- 2. NDDOT will only recognize one classification of Collectors.
- NDDOT will recognize the design characteristics as desired for new functional classification requests, but they will not be a requirement for previously approved classifications.

After the MPO has prepared a draft functional classification map, please submit the information to NDDOT for a preliminary review no later than April 1, 2024. NDDOT will review the submittal and provide comments back to the MPO, as necessary. The MPO's submittal must be a cooperative and coordinated effort with its member jurisdictions.

Once all comments have been addressed, the MPO must submit their final functional classification system via electronic copy no later than July 1, 2024. Submittals shall include a letter requesting approval of the functional classification updates, a breakdown of roadway mileage between classes, a map of the updated system and GIS files. Please note that unless other arrangements have been made with NDDOT, failure to meet the June 1, 2024 final submittal date will result in NDDOT making functional classification changes on the MPO's behalf.




ROLE OF THE MPO


A METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO) IS THE POLICY BOARD OF AN ORGANIZATION CREATED AND DESIGNATED TO CARRY OUT THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING PROCESS. MPOS ARE REQUIRED TO REPRESENT LOCALITIES IN ALL URBANIZED AREAS (UZAS) WITH POPULATIONS OVER 50,000, AS DETERMINED BY THE U.S. CENSUS.

What do we mean by the 3Cs?

- <u>Continuing</u> ongoing, bringing forward the work of the past and re-evaluating as more is known, to continuously plan for the future.
- Cooperative working in cooperation with the public, local agencies, state agencies, and federal agencies. Sometimes delaying the needs of one jurisdiction for the needs of the greater good.
- <u>Comprehensive</u> thorough, studying all modes of transportation, all transportation needs, and all potential scenarios in a multidisciplinary approach.
